

Absentee and Mail Voting Options

No updates required since March 27, 2024

Background

Absentee voting allows voters to cast their ballot without going to a traditional polling place, in most cases by voting through the mail. States differ in the requirements to qualify to vote absentee, with some states allowing any voter to do so and others requiring an excuse, such as a medical emergency. States that conduct all-mail elections, where every eligible voter is mailed a ballot, are categorized here as no-excuse absentee states.

Scoring

- State does not require an excuse to vote absentee, 1 point
- State requires an excuse to vote absentee, 0 points

• State does not require an excuse to vote absentee (<u>Va. Code Ann. § 24.2-700</u>).

Washington (1)

• State conducts vote by mail elections (Wash. Rev. Code § 29A.40.010).

West Virginia (0)

• State requires an excuse to vote absentee (W. Va. Code, § 3-3-1).

Wisconsin (1)

• State does not require an excuse to vote absentee (Wis. Stat. §§ 6.85, 6.86).

Wyoming (1)

• State does not require an excuse to vote absentee (Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 22-9-102).
